And, I am so grateful to have the opportunity to serve as one of the co-chairs for Forever Young – A Tribute to Andrew Young to recognize Andy's immeasurable contributions to Atlanta and the world."

Billye Aaron, wife and widow of legendary baseball player Henry "Hank" Aaron, is a nonprofit executive and former television host. Paul Hagedorn is the Art Director for The Scotts Miracle-Gro Company and is a trustee on the National Jewish Health Council of National Trustees. Billy Payne is the Chairman of Centennial Holding Company, LLC; former Chairman of the Augusta National Golf Club; and former President and CEO of the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games.

Ambassador Andrew J. Young has earned global recognition for his pioneering efforts in civil rights and diplomacy. As a key strategist in civil rights campaigns, he contributed to the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. He later served as the first African American U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, a transformative Mayor of Atlanta, and the co-chair for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Ambassador Young has received over 100 honorary degrees and continues to serve as a champion of justice through the Andrew J. Young Foundation. His legacy is one of leadership, compassion, and tireless advocacy for a better world.
