

Cardiac MRI Expertise Comes to National Jewish Health



Improving Quality of Life for GED Patients

The Gastrointestinal Eosinophilic Diseases Program is a joint program from two world-class healthcare institutions — National Jewish Health and The Children's Hospital in Denver — that provides state-of-the-art, multidisciplinary care to patients affected by eosinophilic gastrointestinal diseases (EGIDs), including eosinophilic esophagitis.

The mission of this unique program is to improve quality of life for patients and families affected by EGIDs. The program offers a comprehensive evaluation for pediatric patients with suspected EGID diagnosis and a comprehensive management program for those with a confirmed EGID diagnosis.

It is the multidisciplinary evaluation that makes this program unique in the region. It can include endoscopy, allergy testing and radiographic analysis that is provided by board-certified pediatric gastroenterologists and allergists. Nutritionists, feeding specialists and social services are also available, when appropriate.

Treatment options are reviewed and discussed in detail with families and appropriate support is provided. Follow up occurs by telephone and during future appointments.

HIV and AIDS Growing Among Women

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) nearly half a million people in the United States are unaware they have HIV. It is estimated that 27% of these people are women.

"HIV is a disease that does not discriminate. It is not just a disease in the homosexual community. It is becoming more prevalent among women and teens," states Ken Lichtenstein, MD, Director National Jewish HIV Clinical and Research Program. "The CDC reports that 80% of the HIV/AIDS cases among female adults and teens, aged 15 to 44, are due to heterosexual contact with a person at high risk for HIV infection and about 19% due to injection drug use."

This group is generally overlooked for HIV testing. Education and early testing are the keys to successful treatment.

Who and When to Test?

Dr. Lichtenstein recommends all physicians follow the CDC Recommendations for HIV testing. These recommendations suggest routine voluntary HIV testing as part of each patient's comprehensive medical care and can lead to early detection of HIV and therefore longer life.

Advanced Diagnostic Laboratories (ADx) developed and now offers a respiratory virus assessment with molecular diagnostics. This panel provides a breakthrough solution needed to identify respiratory infections rapidly and is critical to identifying appropriate and cost effective care of patients.

In general, 70% of respiratory infections are viral, while 30% are bacterial. However, as little as one-fourth of viral lower respiratory tract infections are diagnosed. This is due to the fact that most methods lack sensitivity and a more comprehensive viral diagnostic spectrum.

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
